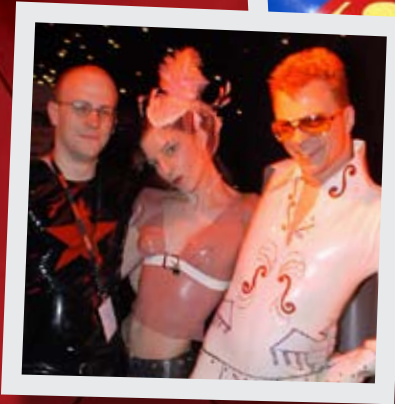

HOW TO USE THIS BOOK

This book was written as an introduction to latex. It is intended for anyone who has a latex fetish. However, it can also be used as a comprehensive reference guide for more experienced latex fetishists or as an introduction for somebody who doesn't know anything about latex fetishism. Instead of being a theoretical guide from a lifestyle outsider, this book is based on my own experiences, and is intended as an eye opener for anybody who wants to enjoy their fetish for latex but is not yet doing so.

The first chapter looks at the possible origins of your latex fetishes and why latex appeals to you so much. The second and third chapters cover all you need to know in order to build a latex wardrobe, from a comprehensive shopping guide to the do's and don'ts of latex care. This is followed by a chapter on coming out and the things that you need to take into account in order to do so. The last two chapters are about how you can connect with the latex fetish community in order to get a network of friends or even a like-minded partner. The first of these chapters covers finding your place in the fetish community, both locally and globally. The second covers how to find and attract a potential latex partner.

Each chapter starts out with an introduction, followed by the content divided into subsections dealing with specific areas and finishes off with a short summary and a suggested list of actions. In each chapter you will also find relevant images and boxes with tips, tricks and facts that can enhance your latex experience.

In the back of the book you will find an appendix and useful online resource guide as well as more information about me, the author.

I have tried my best to cover the questions and issues most beginner latex fetishists encounter, but please keep in mind that I'm not a professional sexual counselor, nor have I completed any special education. This is just my personal advice and suggestions and should be taken as such. What you do with the information is up to you.

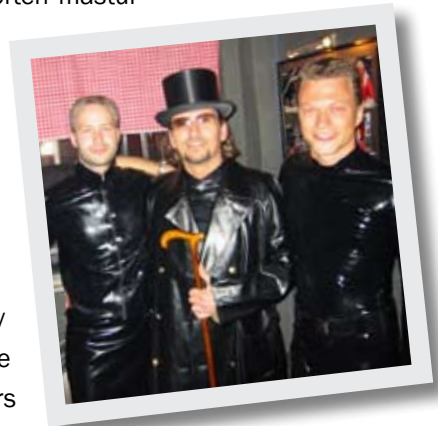

You know, I think that I'm a lot like you. I first discovered my fetish for latex in my early teens. Primarily, it came from wearing rubber rainwear, which the developed further, through the influence of fetish imagery in books and magazines. Throughout my teens I was constantly fantasizing about women in shiny clothing and often masturbated in rubber rainwear. I bought my first latex item, a pair of moulded briefs, in my early twenties and was ashamed, that the latex turned me on so much.

From early on I used to dream about how it would be to wear latex or how fantastic it would be to make love to someone in latex. But since I never had the guts to tell my girlfriend about what I was into, I ended up in a non-kinky marriage. I tried to hint at it, but found that I lacked the words to express my feelings. As a result for many years the pure fear of rejection from my spouse and family and the shame of being thought of as weird kept me from doing anything about it. I was denying

myself what I really wanted and I had nobody to talk to about it. I tried to ignore it to make it go away and even threw out my entire latex wardrobes, twice. I was stuck in the closet... and I was unhappy.

What I really wanted was to live out my latex fetish, to explore my sexuality and to be a part of the fetish community. I dreamed of going to fetish parties and being around like-minded people who understood me. And of course, like everybody else, I dreamed about having a latex lifestyle partner. So I started to look around for a solution. My search

took me to the internet where I became a regular at all the latex forums and kinky chat rooms. I talked to a lot of people around the world, who were either in, or had been in exactly the same situation. This helped me become more and more aware of my situation, what latex fetishism meant to me and what I needed in my life to find happiness. I realized that I had to come out and finally find my path. It was not as easy as saying it might sound. Actually it was one of the most frightening things that I have ever done, but I did it and it was maybe the best thing I ever did for myself.

In the years that followed, I tried to get my partner into latex. I tried everything, from negotiation, counselling and pampering up to ultimatums. Simultaneously, I started a journey into the fetish community. I learned what to wear, where to go and where to meet interesting people. Soon I was living a double life, where I was keeping up appearances in my everyday life and living out my fetish life in the fetish realm.

In the end it became too much for me. I hated the fact that I had to pack away my latex fetish every time I returned home from one of my adventures into the fetish realm. For years I had tried to unite my fetish with a non-kinky relationship, but in the end I realized that I would never find real happiness if I did not fully embrace my latex fetish. This doesn't mean that trying to convert a partner cannot work. It just didn't work for me. So, I left my old life to start a new life - a rubber life!



Today, the latex lifestyle has become a natural part of me and represents who I am. I'm married to a lovely woman - Latex Kitty, who loves me for who I am and shares my love for latex. We enjoy kinky sex, love to explore and try new things. Our home is adorned with latex furniture and fetish artworks. We arrange latex gatherings in our community and are regulars at our local fetish club. We love to travel together to fetish events and meet latex friends from around the world. Being able to live the latex fetish

lifestyle to this extent is much more than I could ever have dreamed of, so naturally, I'm a very happy guy.

During my coming out process I looked all over for a book on how a person can come to terms with a fetish for latex, how to come out to a partner and how to get out and meet people from the fetish community. I never found any. I also realized that there are many others like me out there, who want nothing more than to live out their latex fetish, but for some reason they are unable to make progress.

LATEX AND YOU

Living with a latex fetish can be both a blessing and a curse. If you are able to fulfill your fetish, your love of latex can make you feel like you are in heaven. For some, it may also bring frustration, fear and shame. Many latex fetishists don't understand the reasons for their fetish and as a result, may find it extremely hard to talk to others about it.

One of the hardest things many latex fetishists face is telling their partners, families, and friends about their latex fetish. Some live secret double lives, with a stash of latex clothing hidden away in the deepest part of their basement or closet and a lifetime of unfulfilled dreams.

In this chapter, we will take a closer look at what is behind latex fetishism in order to help you understand yourself better. By enabling you to verbally express the reasons for your latex fetish, it may make it easier for you to tell others about your lifestyle.

Origins

Why am I like this? Why does this material have such power over me? Knowing the answers to these questions can help someone understand the origin of their fetish. It is the first step to a better understanding of it and what makes it so special for you. Many latex

stimulation wired my preference for latex into my brain during puberty.

Do you remember when you first discovered your interest for latex? Think back to your earliest experiences with rubber or latex. Where were you? What were you wearing? What were you doing? I believe that exposure to latex, under the right conditions, combined with strong emotions and/or pleasure, can develop into a latex fetish.

Turn ons

What turns you on about latex? Chances are that you already know the answer to that question. Latex has many qualities that

appeal to the latex fetishist. Understanding these will enable you to more accurately describe what turns you on about latex.

LOOK

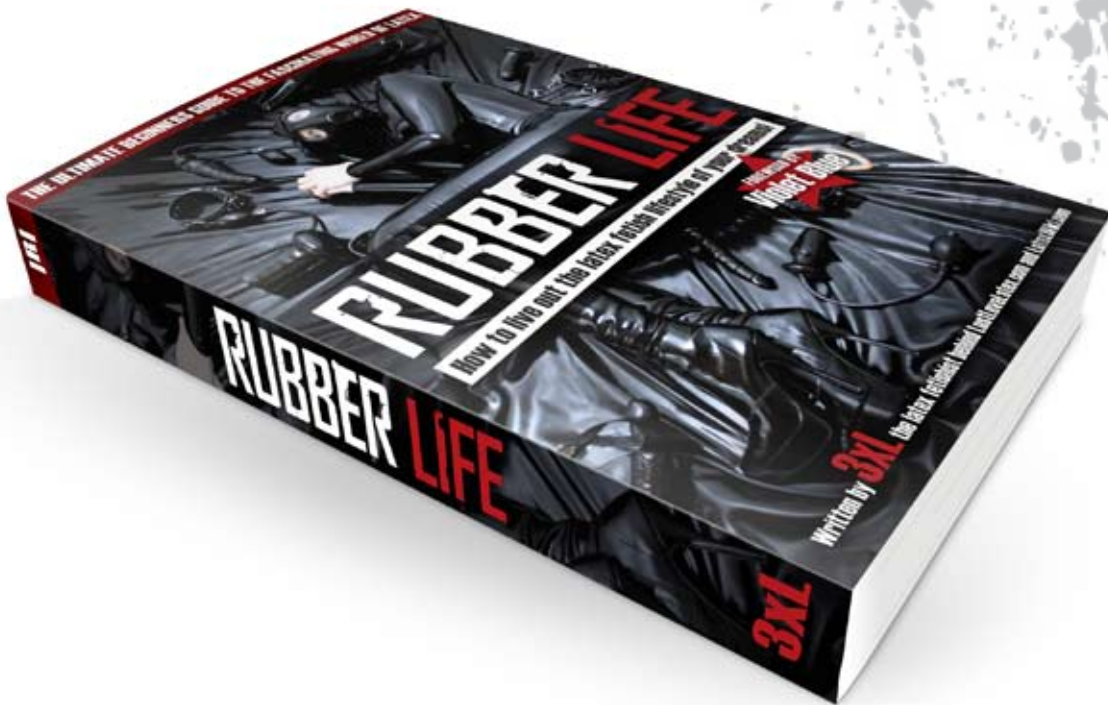
